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Session Objective/Impact:

 Understand the impact of mandatory debriefing as an effective strategy towards optimum well-being while working in acute care.

The Current State of Nurse Well-Being

- Complex patient care needs
- Increased demands of professional registered nurses
- Lack of targeted plan in maintaining personal and professional stamina



Study Questions



Q1. How does the use of mandatory debriefing influence the awareness of perceived stress among registered nurses working in a clinical environment?



Q2. How does the use of mandatory debriefing influence the awareness of coping strategies for registered nurses working in a clinical environment



Q3. How does the use of mandatory debriefing influence the awareness of overall well-being among registered nurses working in a clinical environment?

Importance of the Study

Implementing the current debriefing strategy used in healthcare with a shifting focus on awareness of holistic well being.

Reflective nature of debriefing may promote awareness of positive coping strategies and minimize personal holistic destruction for registered nurses.

Findings: General

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N=21 Feb. 2017=0 July 2017=3 Oct. 2017=18

9 Debriefing sessions

Findings: Research Question 1

How does the use of mandatory debriefing influence the awareness of perceived stress among registered nurses working in a clinical environment?

- Frequency of attendance: July 2017: 1 per session, Oct. 2017: 6-12 per session
- Frequency of verbalized perceived stressors: 63 stressors verbalized with 4 themes emerging
 - a. Patient interaction (n=6)
 - b. Staff/colleague interaction (n=24)
 - c. Unit workflow (n=26)
 - d. Personal skill acquisition (n=7)

Findings: Research Question 2

How does the use of mandatory debriefing influence the awareness of coping behaviors for registered nurses working in a clinical environment?

- Frequency of which a participant was able to describe a manifestation of an effective coping strategy after discussing a stressful situation or occurrence within the clinical setting: 25 strategies
 - Positive/effective (n=18):
 - Self initiated (n=15) & external (n=3)
 - Negative/ineffective (n=7)
 - Self initiated (n=6) & external (n=1)

Findings: Research Question 3

How does the use of mandatory debriefing influence the awareness of overall well-being among registered nurses working in a clinical environment?

- Occurrence and description of specific actions or activities performed for well-being and stress management.
 - Outside of work setting (n=5)
 - Inside work setting (n=2)

Recommendations (practical application)

1. Integration of consistent and frequent opportunities for debriefing that are available to clinical staff for general self-maintenance

(Gunusen & Ustun, 2010; Mullan et al., 2013; Wuthnow et al., 2016)
