### Background

### IOM: The Future of Nursing (2011)

- Recommends a transformation of nursing education!
- More active student learning / competency based education / leadership / non-acute
- More interprofessional learning and teamwork (IPE)/ care coordination

Campaign for Action

- More educational technology
- Seamless academic progression

# In addition to pressures to reform...

### recommendations include:

Increase BSN-prepared nurses to 80% in US

 Double the number of nurses with a doctorate in US (currently about 1%)



# U.S. Affordable Care Act: Impact on Nurse Demand



- Increase in NP demand expected, especially for rural areas.
- Demand for RNs will increase, particularly in outpatient settings and home health care.
- RNs increasingly need skills as care coordinators, case managers, patient educators, and chronic care specialists.

### **Problem**

- Science of Nursing Education is in its infancy!
- We have evidenced-based practice, but not evidenced-based nursing education!
- Lack of benchmarking opportunities for educational initiatives and outcomes!

### Nursing Education: An Underdeveloped Science

- Lack of funding for educational research
- Single-site studies; not generalizable
- Small sample sizes
- Inadequate outcome measures



Lack of comprehensive analytic techniques

### In an age of big data.....



...the Science of Nursing Education is data poor!

### Advantages of Big Data (NIH)

- Timely / Relevant
- Volume / Velocity / Variety
- Accessible / Cost effective

- Facilitates rigorous analytic modeling
- Harvest a wealth of information
- Actionable / Generalizable
- Big Data to Knowledge (NIH)

#### What is the Mission of NNERN?

To develop a large nursing education data base

Use to conduct rigorous nursing education research and advance the science

- Produce sound evidence
- Provide benchmarking opportunities
- Provide longitudinal data that allows schools to trend outcomes over time

#### Mission

- Facilitate schools' quality improvement efforts related to curriculum development, initiatives, faculty / student satisfaction....
- Prepare nursing education scholars and scientists
- Facilitate networking among nursing education scholars and scientists

### What is the Structure of NNERN?

- Non-Profit / Member Driven
- Membership of Schools / Advisory Committee
- Financed through tiered membership fees
- De-Identified data belongs to the Schools!!
- Access to data via an interactive portal
- Benchmarking via an interactive portal
- Data analysis also conducted by NNERN staff

### What will NNERN Do?

- Dialogue with member schools to identify key educational outcome / research questions
- Conduct an annual / web-based survey of faculty and students at each member school
- Core Data....annual items for longitudinal analysis
- Supplemental Data.... some items for most current "hot" issues / emerging issues

### What Else Will NNERN Do?

Clean and de-identify the data



- Ensure each member school has access to their data as well as the entire de-identified data set.
- Manage the technology and database
- In collaboration with member schools produce reports, findings, and recommendations.

### Potential Research Questions

- What is the impact of IPE hours on students' Core Competencies ratings on Interprofessional Collaborative Practice (AACN)? How does your school's IPE hours compare to similar schools?
- Is there are relationship between the percentage of noneacute clinical experiences and student competency ratings and employment patterns?
- Does an innovative teaching strategy such as flipped classroom improve student learning outcomes?
- How does your school's faculty satisfaction scores compare to similar schools? What are the key dissatisfaction factors?
- What are the predictors of faculty dissatisfaction and intentleave their job?

#### Summary: Benefits of NNERN Membership

- Advancing the Science of Nursing Education through big data and cost-effective research.

- Access to researchers and data analysts
- Longitudinal outcome tracking and trending /CQI
